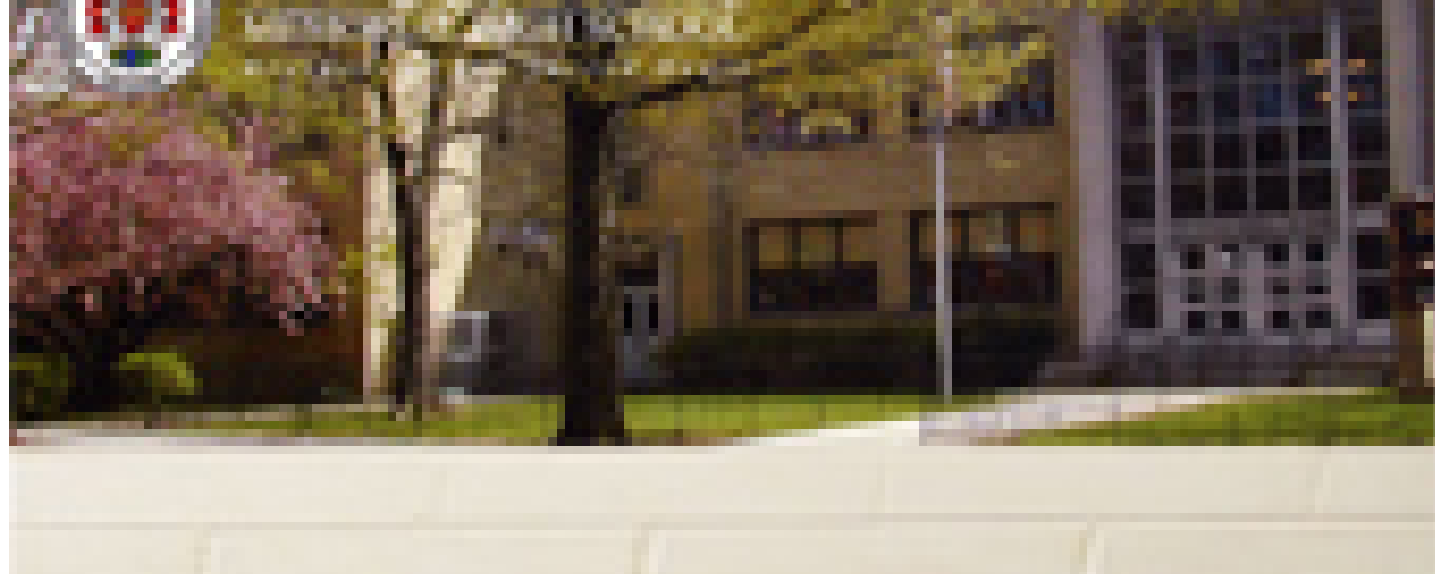
## Assembly Participants in Session

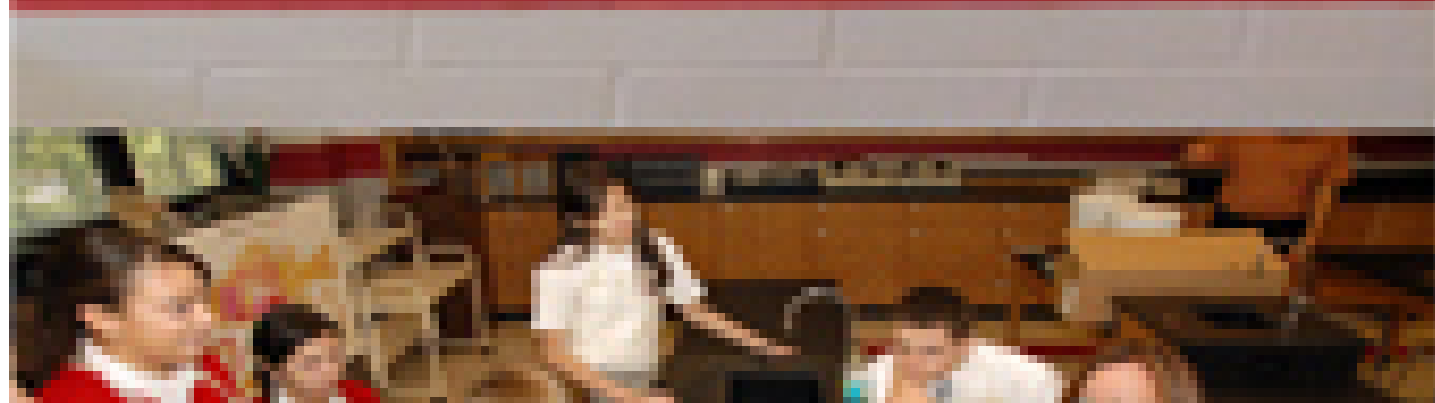
## Alumni Track and Field Reunion

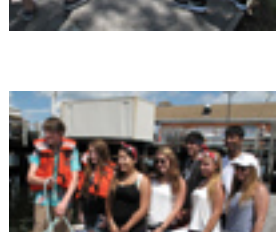
## McClancy's Oyster Farm

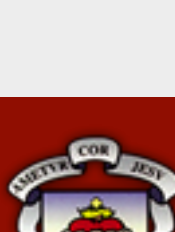
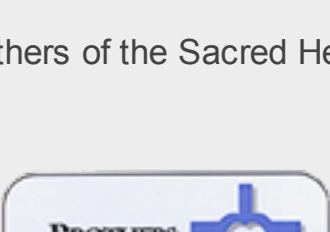
