## Another Honor for Tom Principe '65

FORT KNOX, Ky. — **Retired New York Army National Guard Brig. Gen. Thomas Principe** was inducted into the Reserve Officer Training Corps Cadet (ROTC) Hall of Fame during a ceremony held at the U.S. Army Cadet Command here on June 10. "Army ROTC has had, and continues to have, an exceptionally positive impact on our nation, not just in our defense, but in the development of our citizenry," said Maj. Gen. Christopher Hughes, commander of U.S. Army Cadet Command and Fort Knox, "and much of that credit belongs to the men and women who stand before us today on this field." More than 120 of the initial 326 former ROTC cadets to be honored by Cadet Command were present for the induction ceremony, including Principe, the former Judge Advocate General officer.
